

# Invitation

The Asia-Pacific region accounts for nearly fifty per cent of the world's trade, most of which is transported over sea. Therefore, maritime security is a priority. However, shipping and seaborne trade are threatened by various terrorist and criminal activities at sea. Current weaknesses with providing the necessary security include, among others, lack of maritime awareness, ineffective arrangements for maritime jurisdiction and enforcement, and the lack of capacity of many regional economies to implement new standards regarding ship, cargo and port security. Furthermore, the development of some regional naval powers is reason for concern for others as implications on regional security cannot be ruled out with possible new hegemony on the horizon. This conference aims at presenting and debating Asian and European perspectives on current issues of maritime security in Asia-Pacific and other regions. 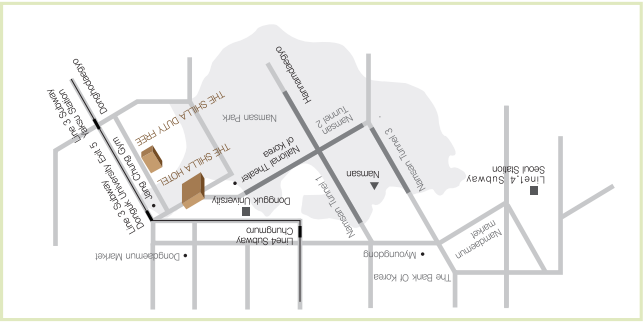
